


Learning

In English this week, we have been learning about recounts and have focused on a short animated story called 'The Black Hat'. The children have been using adjectives to describe; a person, a beautiful creature and also how a person was feeling and writing their thoughts. They also learned how to use time conjunctions to sequence their recounts with words such as: first, then, next, after that, later and finally. They finished the week by writing a recount of the story using all their ideas and work from the week.

In phonics you could practise reading and spelling the tricky words; are, they, went, said, have, like and so.

In maths this week we have been learning that counting in ones can take us a long time! So we have been practising counting in 2s, 5s and 10s which we found to be much quicker. The children have learned that multiplication is repeated addition. Eg: $2 \times 5 = 10$ as 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 10. What is 5×3 ?

It would be good to practise counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s at home to help remember the order. Year 2 practise; 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s.

In topic work children made their collaborative 'Starry Night' picture in the style of Van Gogh each child having their own section to paint. Science work has been related to shadows and how they are formed from light being blocked by an opaque object. During 'Welly Wednesday' the children learned how to identify garden birds and some specific facts about them.
