Games Consoles: Important Things to Consider

There have recently been several incidents of inappropriate language and behaviours, particularly on the playground. While these have been dealt with by the school there is a concern that it may be linked to pupils

hearing inappropriate and offensive language outside of school. We are aware of the popularity of games consoles, and the wide variety of games that children play. While it would be too simple to blame these games, all games are rated, either by the BBFC (British Board of Film Classification) or by PEGI (Pan European Game Information). These ratings relate to the age appropriateness of the content.

The BBFC states that 'All classification decisions are based on the BBFC's published and regularly updated Guidelines. The Guidelines are the

product of extensive public consultation, research and the accumulated experience of the BBFC over many years. They reflect current views on film, DVD and video game regulation.'

PEGI say that 'Age ratings are systems used to ensure that entertainment content, such as films, videos, DVDs, and computer games, are clearly labelled by age according to the content they contain. Age ratings provide guidance to consumers (particularly parents) to help them decide whether or not to buy a particular product.'

More detailed information can be found on each of these organisations' websites where they also give detail on the reasons that games are given the ratings they are. This should be considered when making decisions around the purchase of games and whether their content is age appropriate.
