Learning



Hedgehogs

In English this week the children have completed their non-fiction work by writing their own information text. They have moved on to learning about traditional tales and have used drama to retell a traditional tale. They then changed the characters in the story, wrote a storyboard and used this to write their own version of a traditional tale.

In maths the children have been learning about measurement. They have compared the lengths and heights of different objects, learned to measure length using non-standard units such as cubes and then progressed to using standard units such as metres and centimetres. They also converted metres and centimetres to cms. eg: 1m 35cm = 135cm. They also measured the temperature by reading the scales on a thermometer.

Squirrels

In English, the children have been learning to retell a fictional story. They watched a short film called 'Little Phil and Harry and the Ugly Sharkling'. They thought about the description of the characters and the setting, retelling their own version. They learned to add extra detail and have begun to add speech.



In maths the children have been learning about measurement. They have measured length and height using cm and metres including converting cm into metres. The children made a graph showing the height of each child. They then interpreted data on the graph by answering questions about our height. The children also measured temperature by reading scales on a thermometer and calculating the differences between temperatures.

In topic, we learnt about Egypt and discussed different aspects of ancient Egypt. We designed our own sarcophagus and started to look at Egyptian hieroglyphics.



Rabbits

In maths this week, the children were busy comparing, describing and solve practical problems around measuring the lengths and heights of different objects in the classroom. Whilst doing this, they developed the correct vocabulary to use (e.g. long/short, longer/ shorter, longest/shortest, tall/short, taller/shorter, tallest/shortest). They began to measure in standard units (centimetres) using a ruler.

In English the children listened to the story 'Do you do a Digeridoo?' and worked in pairs to use the pattern of the text to come up with an alternative version, which they enjoyed acting out together. They then went on to write their own version of the story.
