Phonics, Literacy & Numeracy	Reminders and Next Week's Learning
<p>Home Learning Sheets will be provided weekly to share the learning which has taken place during that week at school and looks ahead to the following week. It is very important that this letter is read each week.</p> <p>Thank you to all those parents that are regularly uploading learning observations to Tapestry. See if you can add some learning or an exciting visit completed over the half term break.</p> <p>In Phonics we have begun introducing phonemes (letter sounds). This week we introduced /i/ for ink; /m/ for mouse; /n/ for nut and /d/ for drum. See if you can find these phonemes in your bed time stories or even try to write them at home. So far we have learned the phonemes /s/, /a/, /t/ and /p/.</p> <p>In Literacy we read the story 'The Gruffalo' by Julia Donaldson. We used this book as the basis for a game of 'I Spy', children identified characters by their initial sound (phoneme) and some children attempted to write these letters. See if your child can write the letters we have learnt so far.</p> <p>During maths we have been creating repeating patterns using Autumnal items. Have a go at this activity at home using toys or food.</p> <p>A large proportion of children are finding it difficult to write their name and recognise numbers 0-10. Please practise these key skills with your child.</p>	<p>After Half Term we will base our learning on 'Bonfire Night' & 'Room on the Broom.' If your child has any related items to share please only bring them in for Show & Tell on Friday.</p> <p>Please ensure your child does not regularly bring in toys from home. We are finding they are becoming a big distraction or are causing stress to the children if lost or broken. Thank you.</p> <p>The children will continue to complete a full change for their P.E lessons on Tuesdays. We are also completing Mini Groovers sessions on Mondays after half term so P.E kits will need to be in school on this day too. .</p> <p>Remember to follow us on Twitter @Moorlands_EYFS.</p> <p>All children have now been provided with a home reading book and a reading record. Please try and hear your child read 3 times a week and write comments in the reading record so we can see if your child is reading at home. Staff will change books on most Mondays and Fridays, please make sure reading books are in book bags and placed in the box provided (near each classroom door). If your child leaves their book bag on their peg it might be missed.</p> <p>From the week commencing 6th November we will invite parent readers in to hear children read. Please ensure you have signed up for a free slot on the Parent Readers Timetable and have had a DBS check with the school before starting.</p>
