Phonics, Literacy & Numeracy	Reminders and Next Week's Learning
<p>Home Learning Sheets will be provided weekly to share the learning which has taken place during that week at school and looks ahead to the following week. It is very important that this letter is read each week.</p> <p>The children completed the NSPCC Pants training on Wednesday this week. The aim of this session was to teach children that what is inside your pants and knickers is private and belongs only to them. The Pantosaurus song, which was part of the session, can be found on YouTube or on the NSPCC website.</p> <p>In Phonics we have introduced rhyme and alliteration. See if you can make a rhyming string e.g. dog-log-hog or an alliteration string e.g. apple-ant-anchor.</p> <p>In literacy we read the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. See if your child can retell the story to you and name the healthy food he eats.</p> <p>During Maths we have been ordering numbers from 0-10. Play the game 'Counting Caterpillar' from the website www.ictgames.com to practise this learning</p> <p>A large proportion of children are finding it difficult to write their name and recognise numbers 0-10. Please practise these key skills with your child.</p>	<p>Next week we will base our learning on 'Harvest and Farming.' If your child has any interesting items related to this weekly topic they can bring them to school on Friday for Show and Tell.</p> <p>The children will continue with their P.E lessons on Tuesday. Practise getting changed with your child as this is a key skill that helps your child become independent. Make sure earrings are not worn on this day to keep your child safe.</p> <p>Please ensure your child has a coat in school at all times as the weather is beginning to turn cold.</p> <p>Unfortunately some items of clothing are going missing. Darcie in Voles Class has lost two cardigans. Check all your child's belongings this weekend to ensure your child hasn't taken another child's clothes home by mistake. ALL clothing must be named including coats and shoes. Hand written labels will only last for a short period of time; printed or embroidered name labels are much clearer and will last longer.</p> <p>Mr Snelling is in school but does not teach on Wednesdays as part of his planning and management time. Mrs Murison will teach Voles class on this day with Mrs Howes as the classroom teaching assistant.</p> <p>All children must have a book bag in school to help take home letter, work and their belongings.</p>
