Phonics, Literacy & Numeracy

Reminders and Next Week's Learning

In Phonics we have practised all the phonemes and our segmenting and blending skills. These are the other phonemes we have learnt so far -/s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/, /n/, /m/, /d/, /g/, /o/, /c/, /k/, /ck/, /e/, /u/, /r/, /h/, /b/, /f/, /ff/, /I/, /II/, /ss/, /j/, /v/, /w/, /x/, /y/, /z/, /zz/, /qu/, /ch/, /sh/, /th/, /th/, /ng/, /ai/, /igh/, /ee/, /or/, /oa/, /ar/, /oo/, /OO/, /er/, /ur/, /ow/, /oi/, /air and /ear/.

We have explored segmenting and blending games using the website Phonics Play. Try the game Dragon's Den using Phase 3 phonemes to develop this skill further.

We have also looked at Our Word Tree which currently displays the high frequency words it, is, in, the, I, go, we, me, be, he, she, was, my, you, they, so, said, have, like, there, out, little, what, one, were and when.

In literacy we have been writing in speech and thought bubbles for characters from Jack and the Beanstalk. See if you can find some speech and thought bubbles in shared books and magazines this weekend.

During maths we have been making symmetrical shields using shapes. Try and make symmetrical patterns at home, for example by making symmetrical pizzas.

Next Week Our Learning will be based on Dragons.

Well done to all the children that brought in such creative World Book Day themed potatoes, they were all fantastic!

Your child's Literacy Next Step & Rainbow Words were reviewed this week and their progress has been shared. We will also be reviewing the children's phonic knowledge this week and next week.
