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Learning

Hedgehogs



In English this week the children have been learning to identify and use verbs, identifying and using compound words, using suffixes to change the meaning of words and joining sentences using the words 'that, if because and when'.

In maths this week the children have been learning to divide numbers by sharing, dividing by grouping and also by repeated division using a number line. They applied this to real life problems.

Squirrels

This week in English, the children have been planning their own version of Jack and the beanstalk. They described a magical plant that Jack climbed up.



This week in maths, the children have been playing different maths themed board games. They had to think about the methods they needed to help play the maths games.

Rabbits



The children continued to practice writing instructions in English. They began the week by following instructions to make fruit kebabs which they shared with their Year 5 Reading Buddy. Later in the week, they wrote a set of instructions and followed them to make a cheese and cress sandwich, using the cress they grew as part of their topic work.

The children continued to work on multiplication and division in maths. They used their knowledge of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables to solved one-step 'real life' word problems

E.g. If you have 10 sweets and share them equally between two children, how many will each have? They also consolidated their knowledge of doubles and halves.

TOPIC learning: This week the children have been learning to paint sunflowers based on the famous painting by Van Gogh. Also, the children observed, drew and wrote about the changes that had occurred with the seeds they had planted and learnt about the life cycle of a plant.
