Learning

Hedgehogs



This week in English, the children have been writing their own poems based on similes and using an enriched vocabulary to describe creatures in a rhyming poem. They also have been developing their reading comprehension.

In maths the children have been learning to subtract 2 and 3 digit numbers using written methods. Also they have created maths games and solved different maths puzzles and problems.

Squirrels

This week in English, the children looked at metaphors and similes surrounding colours. They made their own rainbow poems at the end of the week.



In maths, the children have been playing different types of board games with different maths focuses. At the end of the week, Badger class made their own board games and shared them with Squirrel class.
