Phonics, Literacy & Numeracy

In Phonics the children have learnt /s/, /a/, /t/ & /p/. This week we have introduced the phonemes (letter sounds) /i/ for igloo, /n/ for nut, /m/ for meal and /d/ for dig. See if your child can recognise these phonemes and try to write them at home this weekend.

In Literacy we read the story 'The Enormous Turnip.' We used a story map to help retell this traditional tale (see overleaf). See if your child can use the story map to retell the story.

During Maths we used the balancing and weighing scales to measure flour for the baker in 'The giant jam sandwich story.' Involve your child in some weighing/measuring at home this week.

A large proportion of children are finding it difficult to write their name and recognise numbers 0-10. Please practise these key skills with your child.

Open Phonics sessions will begin after half term, these sessions will give parents an opportunity to watch a short phonics lesson on Wednesday mornings. More details to follow soon!

Reading - Reading books have been given to all children. We have created a hand out of the slides from the 'Reading with your child' presentation. These will provide more information and tips. Thank you to all the parents that managed to attend this session. Books will be changed on Mondays & Fridays and will only be done so if a record of reading has been completed. After half we will base our learning on 'Traditional Stories.' In the first week we will focus on Goldilocks & the three bears.' Each child needs to provide a family photograph either a paper copy or on Tapestry for a writing activity. We would
