Appoint 2 extra lunch staff to ensure that the staffing levels allow for adults to organise and run games and sports. Train MSAs to ensure that delivery is high quality.	£7,380	MSAs were used throughout the year to run games and sport. Observations show that children are on the whole more active than before. Lockdown has meant that the full impact of this cannot be seen whilst children are eating and playing separately.	Project needs to be continued as restrictions ease. Monitoring needs to be better next year, once all children can mix.
Improve the resources for PE and outdoor play to ensure that the curriculum intent can be fulfilled.	Audit the resources and prioritise what is needed for the remainder of this academic year Purchase new equipment as needed.	£800	New equipment (£800) has been purchased for lessons and lunchtime. Teachers are now able to deliver the full curriculum (as it currently stands)	The curriculum itself needs to be reviewed and ensure that it is fit for purpose.
Children are able to access PE provision whilst in lockdown, ensuring that active lifestyles continue where possible.	A proportion of the SeeSaw costs to be split between the subjects.
