## Years 5 and 6 Art Overview

#### **Drawing**

To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, with a range of materials.

#### Children can:

- use a variety of techniques to add effects,
  e.g. shadows, reflection, hatching and cross-hatching;
- b depict movement and perspective in drawings;
- use a variety of tools and select the most appropriate;

use key vocabulary to demonstrate knowledge and understanding in this strand: line, texture, pattern, form, shape, tone, smudge, blend, mark, hard, soft, light, heavy, mural, fresco, portrait, graffiti.

### We will learn this through:

Working outdoors to sketch natural forms.

Drawing detailed landscapes that include perspective.

Drawing in the style of Picasso (continuous line)

Using pen and ink (ink wash) to add perspective, light and shade to a sketch.

Creating insect observational drawings.

Creating abstract art using line and shape.

#### **Painting**

To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including painting with a range of materials.

#### Children can:

- create a colour palette, demonstrating mixing techniques;
- b use a range of paint (acrylic, oil paints, water colours) to create visually interesting pieces; use key vocabulary to demonstrate knowledge and understanding in this strand: blend, mix, line, tone, shape, abstract, absorb, colour, impressionism, impressionists

Using colour palettes and characteristics of an artistic movement or artist in artwork (Innuit Art)

Mixing and using tints and shades of colours to paint a landscape.

Using a range of materials to create imaginative and fantasy landscapes.

Painting detailed landscapes that include perspective.

Create a Bee painting in the style of Andy Warhol

Paint abstract images using colour as a focus.

## <u>Sculptures</u>

To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including sculpting with a range of materials.

#### Children can:

- plan and design a sculpture;
- use tools and materials to carve, add shape, add texture and pattern;
- develop cutting and joining skills, e.g. using wire, coils, slabs and slips;
- d use materials other than clay to create a 3D sculpture;

use key vocabulary to demonstrate knowledge and understanding in this strand: form, structure, texture, shape, mark, soft, join, tram, cast.

Creating a relief cast, using a range of tools, techniques and materials.

Create an Inuit soap carving

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Combining stitches and fabrics with imagination to
create a mixed media collage.
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Creating a mixed media collage of a beetle.
Use applique to add decoration to our artwork.
Create an Inuit print using a stencilling technique.
