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## Happy New Year

Welcome back to a new year at the Ark schools. We hope that you had an enjoyable festive season and that 2024 has started well for you all. Both of our schools start the new year with a continued drive to improve standards across the board. Outcomes at Key Stage 2 have been too low for the last few years, and we are determined that 2024 is the year that this changes.

### Peterhouse OFSTED Success

Just before Christmas, Peterhouse was visited by OFSTED for a routine inspection. Previously, the school had been graded as good in 2018.

We are thrilled to be able to announce that the school remains GOOD and that it has received a very positive report .

Highlights include:



'Pupils learn in a calm and purposeful environment. At social times, they play well together. There is mutual respect. Pupils feel safe in school. Unkind language is not something that they hear often. Pupils are confident that if they are worried, they can talk to a trusted adult. They speak highly of the school's pastoral team.'

There is a rigorous approach to the teaching of early reading in the school. Nursery children learn to listen closely, which helps them to learn the sounds they need to blend later on. They enjoy listening to carefully chosen rhymes and stories. Staff expertly deliver the school's chosen phonics programme. They identify quickly when children and pupils in key stage 1 struggle with reading.'

'The identification of the needs of pupils is precise. Staff know pupils exceptionally well. As a result, there is effective support in place for pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).'

The report gave one improvement point -

'In some subjects, the delivery of the curriculum does not always enable all pupils to retain important knowledge in the long term. Consequently, some pupils do not progress well in these subjects. The school should review the curriculum, making sure that pupils have opportunities to revisit key learning, thus enabling pupils to recall more over time.'

On the 8th January, the children at Moorlands were treated to a wonderful pantomime production from M&M productions. The super performance of Snow White was for all year groups, and brought everyone together for a bit of classic panto fun at the start of the new year.

The Ark pantos are an annual fixture at both schools and are fully funded by the Pupil Premium funding that the school receives.





### **Attendance**

This term we will be focusing on pupil punctuality. Our Academy day starts for children in Reception - Year 6 at 08.40am.

Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year.

Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent 2 weeks every year.

Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

19 days lost a year through being late = 90% attendance
