Our art curriculum ensures that children have regular opportunities to study the work of male and female artists from different times and places. They learn about and explore art from other cultures and celebrate different cultural traditions, which helps to broaden their experiences of art in the wider world.

Learning outside of the classroom is encouraged. Children will have the opportunity to visit The Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts, where they can view art from around the world and take part in artistic workshops run by local artists.
